HOW TO BID

It's silent bidding all done on the bid sheets. There's no live auction.

Let's say a host has offered a chicken barbeque for five people with a starting bid of \$20. The sixth bidder must place a higher bid. This bumps the last lowest bidder off the guest list.

Keep checking the bid sheet: if you were outbid and you want to ensure your seat at the barbeque, you must counter with an even higher bid.

In the end, the highest five bids buy tickets to the meal. In case of a tie, the earlier bidder wins.

Bidding ends June 1 at 12:30. Please be present to ensure your wins!

THE RULES

1. Your bid is your contract. Please do not bid if you can't purchase the ticket.

2. Please sign up on the bid sheet with your name, phone number, and email address so we may contact you to tell you if you won! Please write legibly.

3. Each bidder must bid on a separate line. If you want to attend as a couple or family, please use a separate line for each person and bracket your names so we can try to keep you together. (Please check the bid sheets regularly to keep an eye on this).

4. Please do not raise a bid by less than \$5.00.

5. If you find you have been

outbid and you would like to keep bidding, do not erase or change your original bid(s). Please put your name on a new line with your new, higher bid.

6. All winning tickets must be paid for by June 22. We accept cash, check and credit cards. Your ticket price is tax deductible.

7. If you win an auction but then find you are unable to attend, we ask you to give away or resell your tickets. Remember, this is a church fundraiser.

Bid early and bid often, eat well and have fun!
